Rwanda There are two groups in the secondary schools of Kabagayi diocese. Some priests of the CM are the Advisors. Other two groups of the Nyundo diocese are guided by the Daughters of Charity. They are located in Mukungo y Musango. Fr. Osorio said: "These groups grow in Ecclesial, Marian and Vincentian spirit". Mukungo has 8 VMY groups; there are 220 members in total and they are accompanied by four Daughters of Charity. On February 22, for the first time after the creation of the group, in 1999, 26 young made the promise to follow Jesus through Mary. And other 2 VMY members are going to participate in the VF Formation Session in Cameroon.

#### From Appearance to Passion (St. Vincent and St. Paul)

According the last studies on St. Paul, some theologians say that his physical appearance was a true thorn and illness to him: "but though my illness was a trial to you, you did not show any distaste or revulsion. ." (Gal 4, 14) and although he was aware of his weaknesses and thorns, they did not stop him from having a passion and commitment for Christ in his apostolic tasks.

Studies on St. Vincent state that he also suffered for his corporal defeats; he was a lame person (maybe since he was born, maybe after his famous captivity in Tunisia), however, we know his passion for the poor, his braveness before difficult situations and circumstances and his strength to act and change the face and image of the poor, seeing in them the face of Christ... we know that this man has changed the face of the Church...

Today, we are also invited to have a passion for Christ, to fall in love with Him. He has to be the foundation of our life, especially when we carry out the activities of our VMY communities, in spite of our own thorns and "limps". Do we dare to name the present thorns and limps that limit the progress of our group and community?

Christ was the foundation of St. Paul and St. Vincent; each had his own deep experiences with Him. Nowadays, we are invited to take our commitment with the Association in our countries seriously, either as advisors, or as people-in-charge of our centres or groups; but if we do not lead our members to a deep experience with Christ and a clear consecration to our Mother, everything is left up in the air; and all our activities could become a work for the kingdom of God, but without taking in account the will of God. Today, the apathy is widespread in our society, our church and maybe in our VMY or VF communities! The passion for Christ characterized St. Paul; the passion for the poor, our Lords and Masters was the distinctive sign of St. Vincent. Neither of them gave up... In this time of crisis, pandemic, atheism and global consumerism, we, as VMY members are called, more then ever, to rediscover the passion for Christ and for the others.... the passion that is able to do everything...

## "Serving the poor is serving God"

The "fraternal soup pot" (la marmite de soupe fraternelle), was born in the summer 2007, when we, 25 members of a VMY group of central Vietnam noticed the hunger and loneliness that some brothers and sisters of the zone suffered.

Some months later we organized it better. Now, the group rents a small land to cultivate the rice by itself. There was a time when the "fraternal soup pot" was distributed twice a week.

Every Sunday, from 5 am, 8 members start the preparation of the soup with enthusiasm and good humour. Thus, elder and sick people could have their warm soup in time. After that, we distribute the soup in some houses. Finally we do the washing-up.

This simple service to our brothers and sisters has helped us to grow in unity, cordiality, responsibility and fraternity. Through the service to the less privileged, we could offer our Christian testimony and above all, we could fill life of people, who is abandoned to their fate, with joy. We would like to be able to continue with this experience and spread it in other parishes. Our light is called to bright around us for the Glory of God and the good of the weak.

At the beginning, the money to finance this activity was from the parochial collect and private donations; some members got a job (as building workers, collecting rubbish or
