The cause for beatification of Msgr. Schraven as a martyr has been approved last January 18, 2013 by the Congregation for the Causes of Saints. His cause has been elevated for scrutiny through the efforts of Msgr. Schraven Foundation, the Dutch Province and Diocese of Roermond. Msgr. Schraven and 7 other Vincentians were brutally killed in 1937 by invading Japanese soldiers while protecting Chinese women to become "comfort women", which has become known as the "Massacre of Zhengding Church".
