reflect on the true meaning of expressing good wishes to those individuals who are celebrating a birthday. Do we really mean what we say? Are we simply repeating words and phrases without reflecting on their profound meaning? Are our words of congratulations a true expression of our desire for that person's happiness?

During the month of December we celebrate the birthday of the One to whom we owe everything; the One who being God, became man; the One who is God with us (Matthew 1:23); the One who put aside his divinity and became incarnate in order to save us; the One who was born in very humble surroundings.

During this Christmas season let us be mindful of the fact that each time that we share hugs and kiss and smiles, each time that we say Merry Christmas or other such phrases that express our hope for another person, we are at the same time desiring that Jesus, present in our brothers and sisters, should have a happy birthday. SELF-FINANCING PLANS FOR SELF-FINANCING IN THE VMY



When the self-financing campaign for our Association was launched

three years ago, the need for this had been addressed on two separate occasions: the final document of the General Assembly in Paris (2005) and the final document of the General Assembly in Lisbon (2010). Article #5 of the 2010 document states this very well: Solidarity with our Association should lead us to share from the depths of our own poverty. In other words, the love that we have for our Association, despite being an association that is formed primarily of young students, should help us to gather together the funds that we need. A truly crazy idea! How can this be possible since most of us are not working? Here we must place our trust in our society which has become ever more secularized.

Saint Vincent reminds us that our love must be inventive unto infinity. So we can ask: how much do we love our Association? Behind this question we find a very direct implication with regard to our sense of belonging to the Association and our acceptance of the message that was proclaimed at the Rue du Bac in Paris. The very same woman, who asked a similar question at the time of the Annunciation, placed her trust in God and gave to humankind a great gift: she allowed the Word to become flesh. At the same time we must recall the fact that Mary also gifted us with her medal, a medal which makes the impossible become possible. The VMY is part of this Marian heritage and today she invites us to believe in her Son. She asks us to confidently place our needs before Jesus because everything is possible to the one who has faith (Mark 9:23).

Thanks to God some groups have had a wonderful experience in this area of searching for self-financing. Here are some examples: France has opted to sell personalized calendars; the groups in Rwanda-Burundi have begun small projects with the assistance of the International Team and France; the United States continues to sell second hand goods on-line, etc. All of these examples mean that self-financing is not some mere theory ... some groups have already implemented the means that make this theory a reality and they are willing to share with all the groups their experience in this area.

Let us have no doubts about this campaign because we have in our hands two powerful arms: our youth and the maternal protection of our Mother, the Star of the Sea who guides her children to Jesus.

WITNESS ECCLESIAL NOTE OF THE VMY IN SPAIN

Delegation of the lay apostolate (DAS)

"I believe in the Church, that is one, holy, catholic and apostolic." The primary task of the Church is to proclaim the Good News to all people and to do this from the reality of God who became man through the Incarnation of Jesus Christ. We can experience ourselves as loved by God with such an intense love that we feel impelled to share that same love with our sisters and brothers. Indeed, our hearts of stone have been transformed by this love into hearts of flesh and, as a result, we are able to suffer with those who suffer and able to weep with those who weep.

In light of this reality it is very easy to understand the presence of the VMY in the Delegation of the Lay Apostolate in the Archdiocese of Madrid (or in any other diocese in Spain or in any other diocese in the world). The Delegation is composed of a large number of religious associations and institutions that are ministering in a specific area and that are characterized by a predominant presence of the laity in their organization, government and membership. The auxiliary bishop of Madrid, D. César Franco, advises and guides the apostolic ministry that is developed by the Delegation. Our task, in the first place, is focused on knowing and establishing relationships with different association and institutes that are members of the Delegation. In this way we can then plan formation initiatives, meetings, and common projects, etc. ... all of which are intended to ground us in our responsibility to experience ourselves as evangelizers in the midst of our different situations.

To be able to represent the VMY in the Delegation of the Lay Apostolate means many things, but above all else it reinforces my feeling of belonging to the ecclesial community. It provides us with an opportunity to meet with many other brothers and sisters who, from the perspective of their proper charism, live out their call from God to be witnesses in the midst of the world. They give this witness to God with all their limitations and are united

through prayer and love which they want to share with others. My participation in this group makes me feel co-responsible for this process of evangelization and therefore committed to a process of collaboration with those persons who have dedicated their whole life to God so that the liberating message of the Good News might be communicated to all people. At the same time I have become aware of the fact that in many situations, priests and men and women religious are unable to do this because of the prejudices that their option stirs up in many people. My faith is strengthened and enriched with the witness of life than many other people give and who, together with me, desire to walk with the Lord. All of this leads me to commit myself personally and as a member of the VMY to engage in ministry and to understand that as a layperson I am coresponsible with consecrated persons for maintaining the boat of Peter afloat and guiding it to the shores of new horizons where people, without being aware of it, are hungry and thirsty for God and for God's liberating message.

Let us take advantage of this time of our youth to discover Jesus Christ, to discoveer the One who is the way and the truth and the life

Youth is a privileged time for seeking and encountering truth. As Plato said: "Seek truth while you are young, for if you do not, it will later escape your grasp" (Parmenides, 135d) ... I urge you, then, never to lose that sense of enthusiasm and concern for truth (Pope Benedict XVI, Meeting with young university professors in Madrid,
