
All: Have mercy on us, O Lord.

Systemic Change in the Vincentian Charism



In our Vincentian charism we are called to both Charity AND Justice. Systemic Change among those living in poverty aims beyond providing food, clothing, shelter and alleviating immediate needs. It enables people themselves to engage in the identification of the root causes of their poverty and to create strategies, including advocacy, to change those structures which keep them in poverty. Systemic Change requires transforming attitudes and systems.

Fredrick Ozanam, the principal founder of the Society of St.
Vincent de Paul, made precisely the same point: "Charity is not sufficient. It treats the wounds but does not stop the blows that cause them ... Charity is the Samaritan who pours oil on the

wounds of the traveler who has been attacked. It is Justice's role to prevent the attacks."

In our efforts toward systemic change, we seek not only to assist the poor in their immediate needs by providing food, clothing and shelter, but to help them change the social system within which they live, so that they might emerge from poverty. That work carries forward the heart of Vincent's direction for the Vincentian Family, changing the 'hand-out' to a 'hand-up.'

We can turn to St. Vincent de Paul's writings for guidance and examples that promote charity **AND** justice. 1) Our love is to be both "affective and effective" 2) We minister to the poor "spiritually and corporally" 3) We are to proclaim the good news "by word and work."
